Prelude Jerusalem

Lighting the Christ & Rainbow Candle

As we light the Christ Candle, we remember the light that no darkness can overcome—the light of love that meets us as we are and calls us into community with one another. We light the Rainbow Candle to celebrate the many colors of God's people—the full spectrum of love, identity, and belonging—each one a reflection of divine light! *The candles are lit*.

Land Acknowledgement

Many thousands of years before we gathered here, Indigenous peoples lived, worked, cared for, and worshipped on this land. Their deep connection to the land, waters, skies, and all living beings has shaped this place. Over time, settlers—ourselves and those before us—arrived and too often disrupted these sacred relationships, causing harm to the land and to the peoples who have always belonged to it. We acknowledge that we are on the traditional and unceded territory of the Anishinaabe, Haudenosaunee, Wendat, Chippewa, and Mississaugas of the Credit, and that this land remains the ancestral home of many diverse Indigenous nations.

As we light our candles, we give thanks for the caretakers of this land—past, present, and emerging—and we pray for courage and humility on our shared journey toward truth, justice, and reconciliation.

Opening Hymn

Passing the Peace

Jesus taught that God is not the God of the dead, but of the living—and that all who live in God are alive to one another. The prophet Micah reminds us that to walk humbly with God is to walk gently with each other. So, in this sacred community of the living, let us share not only words, but a spirit of peace—peace born of justice, mercy, and love made real.

The peace of Christ—the peace of the living God—be with you all. And also with you.

Life and Work

Opening Prayer

Let us pray:

God of justice and mercy, You are the heartbeat of creation, the pulse that stirs us from death into life. We come before you carrying both gratitude and grief— for the beauty of courage, and the brokenness of our world. Open our hearts this morning to your transforming love.

Lift our eyes from what has been, toward what can yet be.

Where we cling to fear, teach us faith.

Where we cling to pride, teach us humility.

Where we cling to silence, teach us compassion in action.

For you are not the God of the dead, but of the living—

and we long to live as your resurrected people, through Christ, who shows us the way.

We Cannot Own the Sunlit Sky

MV 143

1 We cannot own the sunlit sky,
the moon, the wildflow'rs growing,
for we are part of all that is
within life's river flowing.
With open hands receive and share
the gifts of God's creation,
that all may have abundant life
in ev'ry earthly nation.

2 When bodies shiver in the night and weary, wait for morning, when children have no bread but tears, and war-horns sound their warning, God calls humanity to wake, to join in common labour, that all may have abundant life in one-ness with their neighbour.

3 God calls humanity to join as partners in creating a future free from want or fear, life's goodness celebrating, that new world beckons from afar, invites our shared endeavour, that all may have abundant life and peace endure forever.

RECEIVING GOD'S WORD

Scripture Micah 6:6-8

⁶ "With what shall I come before Spirit and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before God with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? ⁷ Will Spirit be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?" ⁸ God has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does Spirit require of you but to do justice and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God?

Luke 20:27-38

²⁷ Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him ²⁸ and asked him a question: "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. ²⁹ Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman and died childless; ³⁰ then the second ³¹ and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. ³² Finally the woman also died. ³³ In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her."

³⁴ Jesus said to them, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage, ³⁵ but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. ³⁶ Indeed, they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. ³⁷ And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. ³⁸ Now he is God not of the dead but of the living, for to him all of them are alive."
