Welcome

Lighting the Christ Candle

At the heart of our faith is a light that does not flicker out—a light born in love, a light that has learned the shape of human life, a light that calls us forward, even when the way is unclear. Our Christ Candle serves as a reminder that the light of Christ shines not behind us in the past, but ahead of us, guiding our every step. *Candle is lit.*

Lighting the Rainbow Candle

We also light the Rainbow Candle—a symbol of God’s covenant love, reminding us that our diversity is not an obstacle to God, but a reflection of God’s creativity and joy. *Candle is lit.*

Land Acknowledgement

As we gather in this season of Epiphany—a season of light, revelation, and awakening—we acknowledge the land on which we worship. This land has long been home to Indigenous peoples, including the Anishinaabe, the Haudenosaunee, the Wendat, the Chippewa, and the Mississaugas of the Credit. It is a land where wisdom has been shared, relationships tended, and stories carried across generations. We also acknowledge that this land remains home to many diverse Indigenous nations and communities, whose presence, resilience, and leadership continue to shape this place.

May the light of Epiphany guide us toward truth, right relationships, and shared care for this land and for one another.

Scripture Matthew 3:13-17

¹³ Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. ¹⁴ John tried to dissuade Jesus, saying, "I should be baptized by you, and yet you come to me!" ¹⁵ But Jesus answered him, "Leave it this way for now. We must do this to completely fulfill God's justice." So, John reluctantly agreed. ¹⁶ Immediately after Jesus had been baptized and was coming up out of the water, the sky suddenly opened up, and Jesus saw the Spirit of God descending as a dove and hovering over him. ¹⁷ With that, a voice from the heavens said, "This is my Own, my Beloved, on whom my favour rests."

Sermon Beloved Before Anything Else

Remembrance of Baptism

At the Jordan River, Jesus stepped into the water—not to stand above, but to stand among. In baptism, God names us beloved, claims us as God’s own, and sends us into the world rooted in grace.

The water before you is a sign of God’s promise—a promise spoken before we strive, before we prove, before we are certain. In a few moments, you are invited to come forward, as you are able and as you feel led, to dip your fingers into the water and remember your baptism—or to remember God’s love and claim upon you.

There is no right or wrong way to participate. You may come forward, remain seated in prayer, or simply watch and receive the blessing.

As you touch the water, remember these words: “You are my Beloved.”

(Soft music plays while folks come forward)

Beloved of God,
you are claimed by grace.
You are held in love.
You are never alone.

**We are God’s beloved,
and we will live from love.**
