Prelude

As we light the Christ Candle, we remember the light that no darkness can overcome—the light of love that meets us as we are and calls us into community with one another. We light the Rainbow Candle to celebrate the many colors of God's people—the full spectrum of love, identity, and belonging—each one a reflection of divine light! *The candles are lit*.

Land Acknowledgement

Many thousands of years before we gathered here, Indigenous peoples lived, worked, cared for, and worshipped on this land. Their deep connection to the land, waters, skies, and all living beings has shaped this place. Over time, settlers—ourselves and those before us—arrived and too often disrupted these sacred relationships, causing harm to the land and to the peoples who have always belonged to it. We acknowledge that we are on the traditional and unceded territory of the Anishinaabe, Haudenosaunee, Wendat, Chippewa, and Mississaugas of the Credit, and that this land remains the ancestral home of many diverse Indigenous nations.

As we light our candles, we give thanks for the caretakers of this land—past, present, and emerging—and we pray for courage and humility on our shared journey toward truth, justice, and reconciliation.
